PROSPECTUS FOR ADMISSION TO THE *PG PROGRAMMES UNDER CHOICE BASED CREDIT AND SEMESTER (CBCS) SYSTEM* IN THE COLLEGES AFFILIATED TO THE *KANNUR UNIVERSITY* FOR THE ACADEMIC YEAR *2018-19*

1. INTRODUCTION

- 1.1. Prospectus for admission to the **Post Graduate Degree Programme Under Choice Based Credit and Semester (CBCS) system** in Government/Aided / Self Financing Affiliated Colleges for the academic year 2018-19, as approved by the Kannur University, is published. It contains general information and rules relating to the admission to the **CBCS PG Programmes** in Govt./Aided/Self Financing Affiliated Colleges of the University.
- 1.2. The conduct of the university PG programmes shall be governed by the regulations in force with effect from 2014-15 admission (based upon the Hrudayakumari committee report).
- 1.3. Admissions to the seats to be filled by the University for the Post Graduate Degree Programmes (except those specifically mentioned) are regulated on the basis of the grade points obtained in the qualifying examination. The details of seats to which admissions are made through the rank list prepared accordingly are contained in the relevant paragraphs. (Clause 4.1).
- 1.4. As per Kannur University Statute, 'no student shall be admitted to any course of instruction in the Colleges in anticipation of Affiliation'.

2. GENERAL INFORMATION

Revised Regulation for PG programme under Credit Based Semester System has been implemented with effect from 2014 admission. Starting from this year (2018-19), the admission to the PG Degree Programme under CBCS system in the Arts and Science Colleges affiliated to the Kannur University shall be made on the basis of **Online Centralized Admission**. The **Online admission process** will provide the candidates with an opportunity of obtaining admission to any of the Colleges/Programmes of the University of his/her choice on the basis of merit.

Any candidate who desires to obtain admission under the Kannur University for the PG Programme should compulsorily register through online before the closure of registration, irrespective of the Category (General /SEBC/ BPL/ SC/ST/ Community /Management / Candidates from Union Territory of Lakshadweep/Andaman Nicobar Dweep/ Jammu and Kashmir/Persons With Disabilities/ widows /wards of Armed Forces Personnel, killed or disabled in action during peace time/ Sports etc.) to which he/she belongs .

The rank list of the candidates to the various Programmes and Colleges will be on the basis of merit strictly following the rules and regulations regarding reservation.

The University will not be conducting online centralized admission for the following PG Programmes/Courses.

1. MA Bharathanatyam programme at Lasya College of Fine Arts, Pilathara
2. MSc Electronics programme at PKKM college, Mananthawady
3. MCJ programmes at Don Bosco College, angadikadav & SES College, Sreekandapuram.

2.1 Authority to prescribe qualification for admission to the various courses of studies.

As per Sub-Section (v) and (vi) of Section 25 of the Kannur University Act, 1996, the Academic Council shall have the power to prescribe qualifications for admission of students to the various courses of study (and to the Examinations) and the conditions under which exemptions shall be granted, and to make provision for the admission of students to the various courses of studies on the basis of merit in order to maintain the standards of education.

2.2 Agreement for Direct Payment -Relevant provisions for admission to the various courses in aided colleges.

Article 18 of the Agreement for Direct Payment entered into between the Government and the

Educational Agencies of Private Colleges stipulates that all future admission of students to the private

affiliated colleges shall be on the following basis, viz :

- a) Twenty percent of the total number of seats in each college shall be reserved for students belonging to the Scheduled Castes and Scheduled Tribes. Those seats which cannot be filled on this basis shall be filled on the basis of merit from among backward minority communities, in the case of colleges run by a backward minority communities and by OEC, in all other cases.
- b) *Ten/Twenty **percent of the seats shall be reserved for the candidates belonging to the community to which the college belongs. These seats will be filled strictly on the basis of merit from among the students of the said community.
- c) *Fifty/Forty **percent of the seats will be filled by open selection on the basis of merit.
- d) 20% of the seats for admission will be reserved as management quota

Note: * This will apply to Forward Community Colleges
 **This will apply to Backward Community Colleges

3 PROGRAMMES, INSTITUTIONS AND SEATS

3.1 Details of the Programme and Duration: The Programme leads to Post Graduate Degree in the relevant subject. Each Programme extends for a period of four semesters. The Programme of study shall be by regular attendance for the requisite number of lectures, practical training and other means.

3.2 Institutions and Subjects for the PG Degree Programme : The List of Colleges affiliated to the Kannur University and the subjects offered in each institution is given as **Annexure I**, of the Prospectus.

3.3 Categorization of Seats: Seats available in Govt./Aided/Self financing affiliated Colleges are mainly classified as Merit Seats, Community Seats, Management Seats and Reservation Seats

- a) **Merit Seats:** The seats that are filled by the University in Government/Aided/Self - financing Affiliated Colleges purely on the basis of merit are classified as 'Merit Seats'.
- b) **Community Seats:** The seats in Aided Colleges that are filled by the Management concerned, on the basis of merit among their community candidates, are classified as 'Community Seats'
- c) **Management Seats:** The seats in Aided and Self-financing Affiliated Colleges that are filled by the Managements concerned are classified as 'Management Seats'.
- d) **Reservation Seats:** The seats in Government/Aided/Self-financing Affiliated Colleges, which are earmarked for SC/ST/SEBC/BPL/PWBD Sports persons are classified as 'Reservation Seats'

4 RESERVATION OF SEATS

A candidate can claim only one benefit at a time as per his/her choice for a particular purpose.

4.1 Types of Reservation: Seats will be reserved for the following categories in Govt., Aided and Self financing Affiliated Colleges for various PG Degree Programmes.

- a) Mandatory Reservation
- b) Reservation for Persons Differently Abled
- c) Special Reservation and
- d) Reservation for Nominees

4.1.1 Mandatory Reservation

a. Government Colleges

Note: The seats under community quota in Aided Colleges will be filled by the concerned Management on the basis of merit and on the basis of community certificate issued by the Revenue Authorities/Parish Priest/any other Competent Authority

(c) **Self-Financing Affiliated Colleges (including IHRD):** In Unaided colleges and Self financing programmes conducted in Aided colleges, 50 % of the total seats shall be filled by the management from among candidates of their choice provided they satisfy the eligibility conditions. The remaining seats (50%) shall be distributed and filled as detailed below

The candidates who apply under management quota shall also register online before closure of admission.

Note: The fee structure of the Self-financing Colleges is higher than that of Govt/Aided Colleges

4.1.2 Reservation for Persons with Benchmark Disability (PWBD):

(i) As per the order No. Acad/D2/3347/2017 dated 12/05/2017, 5% of the total seats will be set apart exclusively for persons with benchmark disabilities in Government & Aided Colleges. The remaining seats will be considered as one single unit for providing reservation mentioned in the GO (MS) No.107/08/Higher Edn, dated 30/08/2008.

As per Clause 2(r), Chapter I of The Rights of Persons with Disabilities Act, 2016, 'Person with benchmark disability' means a person suffering from not less than 40% of a specified disability where specified disability has not been defined in measurable terms and includes a person with disability where specified disability has been defined in measurable terms, as certified by the certifying authority. Candidates seeking admission under PWBD category should submit the 'Certificate of disability' (permanent), by the District Medical Board or bodies of higher status, certifying the degree of percentage of disability. Based on the details furnished in the online application, candidates will be provisionally included under the 'Persons with Benchmark Disability' category.

Note: The selection of candidates under this category will be based on the rank in the inter-merit list and physical suitability and not on the basis of the Degree of disability.

No reservation of seat is allowed for Blind candidates for Science subjects.

4.1.3 SPECIAL RESERVATION

Sportsperson One seat for every 20 seats will be reserved for outstanding sports persons for PG course in affiliated colleges. Where the number of seats is less than 20 for a subject, the seats in all the PG courses shall be pooled together and one seat for every 20 seats will be reserved as sports quota seat, limited to one seat in each course.

- i. A minimum of one seat will be reserved for PG course in a College, if the total PG seats are less than 20
- ii. The sports quota seats for PG course will be given over and above the sanctioned strength of the course
- iii. The minimum eligibility for sports quota admission shall be representing the University from Kerala State in All Inter University competition including Zonal Inter University Championships.

- Minimum achievements for PG admission under Sports Quota will be securing first place in the Intercollegiate Championship (28 marks)

Explanations

1. Achievements in those sports disciplines approved by Association of Indian Universities only will be considered for Sports Quota Admissions.
 2. Approved World Competitions means the Competitions organized by the International Apex Bodies of the concerned discipline and in which the national Teams are sponsored by the National Apex Bodies and cleared by Sports Authority of India/ Government of India.
 3. The National Championship means the Championships conducted by the National Apex Bodies of the concerned discipline. District Competition means revenue district competition conducted by district association in respective sports
 4. Individual games/ event means a game/ event in which individual performs alone.
 5. When a candidate has number of achievement in a sports / different discipline his/ her best achievement will be taken into consideration.
 6. The sports achievements in two academic years (i.e. from 01st June to 31st May) just previous to the year of selection alone shall be considered. However, in the case of competitions, which are not organized annually, the immediate previous competitions shall be considered.
 7. All competitions where an upper age limit is fixed (Youth/ Junior/ Sub-Junior) would be treated as junior event provided it is not classified as senior event by the concerned National Federation.
 8. Priority will be given for students having achievements in senior level competitions than Junior and Youth category competitions.
9. **When there is tie in the rank/mark the following criteria will be applied to break the tie:**
- (a) **Priority will be given as per of their order of merit
i.e.; 1st, 2nd and 3rd place respectively.**
 - (b) If the tie still remains those with a more number of achievements in the same level will be placed above the others. (more number of I places, more number of II places and so on.)

- (c) If the tie still remains the next best achievement as per the order merit will be considered.
- (d) If the tie is not broken by the above method the person having the achievements during the year closer to the selection will be given higher rank.
- (e) Individual achievements will be ranked above team achievements.
- (f) A new record is created, he/she will be given priority.
- (g) If a tie cannot be broken by any of the above mentioned sports achievements, the marks obtained in the qualifying examination will be considered for breaking the tie.

NOTE:

The Sports Quota candidates should also register through online before the closure of registration date. The student should submit printout of the application (along with copies of sports certificates) to the Physical Education Department of the concerned college with a request. The Physical Education Department of the college will prepare a rank list as per the University norms. The rank list should be published in the college notice board for student's redressal before a minimum of three days for the final publication of the rank list. The final list shall be forwarded to the University for approval and admissions shall be made after obtaining the approval of the University.

If vacancies arise due to discontinuation of candidates under Sports quota, the next eligible candidate in the Rank List shall be admitted.

The above candidates should also register through online before the closure of registration. The student should submit printout of the application (along with copies of sport certificates) to the principal of the college concerned with a request. The Principal thereafter, with the help of the Department of Physical Education of the College will prepare a rank list as per the University norms. The rank list should be published in the college notice board for student's redressal before a minimum of three days for the final publication of the rank list. The final list shall be forwarded to the University for approval and admissions shall be made after obtaining the approval of the University.

4.1.4 Reservation for Nominees

i) Reservation for Candidates from Union Territory of Lakshadweep.

An additional seat shall be created for each PG Degree Programme (wherever necessary) in all affiliated colleges, exclusively for the purpose of accommodating students sponsored by the Union Territory of Lakshadweep. This seat shall not be filled up by other candidates. The Head of the Institutions should forward the list of such candidates to the University after admission. (Govt. letter No.5455/B3/2006/H.Edn. dated 15-3-2006).

ii) Concession for Wards of Kashmiri Migrants

The following relevant concessions are applicable for wards of Kashmiri Migrants for admission to the PG courses in all Affiliated Arts & Science Colleges.

- Extension in date of admission by about 30 days.
- Relaxation in cut off percentage up to 10% subject to minimum eligibility requirement.
- Increase in intake capacity upto 5% course wise.
- Waiving of domicile requirements.
- Facilitation of migration in second and subsequent years.

(iii) Reservation for Candidates from Jammu and Kashmir.

Two seats shall be created over and above the sanctioned strength to accommodate candidates belonging to Jammu&Kashmir for admission to PG courses in the affiliated colleges for the academic year 2018-19.

IV) Reservation for students from Mahe

One additional seat shall be created over and above the sanctioned strength in 3 Government colleges ,as detailed below ,to accommodate candidates belonging to Mahe. In the absence of students from Mahe, no admission shall be done among the students of Kerala in those additional seats.

(vi) Reservation of seats for the widows /wards of Armed Forces of Personnel killed/disabled in action during peace time.

Additional seats over and above the sanctioned strength may be created as and when required for the widows /wards of Armed Forces Personnel killed or disabled in action during peace time, in Central /State Universities /Autonomous/ Professional / Non-Professional Institutions under the purview of Ministry of Human Resource Development as per UGC policy.

5. CLAIMS FOR MANDATORY RESERVATION AND CERTIFICATES TO BE PRODUCED

(i) Claims for Mandatory Reservations must be made by a candidate at the time of submission of online application. Candidates should mention their claim in the **relevant columns** in the Personal and Academic Data Sheet. They should also satisfy the eligibility conditions as per the Prospectus, at the time of Online registration.

(ii) Candidates should produce all original documents to prove their claims made in the online application form, at the time of admission, before the Principal. **The claims that are not mentioned at the time of online submission of application will not be entertained even if supporting evidences are produced later on. The claims for mandatory reservation ,once made ,cannot be altered by the candidate under any circumstances.**

5.1.1 Claim for Community reservation under 'Socially and Educationally Backward Classes' (SEBC):

Reservation of seats to the Socially and Educationally backward Classes will be in accordance with the provisions contained in G.O. (P) 208/66/Edn. dated 2.5.1966, as amended from time to time.

(a) As per G.O. (Ms) No.02/2017, Backward Community Development, dated 08/03/2017 , candidates belong to Socially and Educationally Backward Classes under NON CREAMY LAYER category are eligible for reservation under this category. The candidates belonging to the Communities included in the SEBC list alone will be eligible for the benefit of reservation under this category.

b. Applicants claiming reservation under Community quota in aided Colleges, who belong to the community of the Management which runs the college, will have to produce community certificate from the Revenue authority/Parish Priest/any other competent authority concerned, along with the application.

5.1.2 Claim for Reservation under Scheduled Castes/Scheduled Tribes quota

(a) Candidates claiming reservation under Scheduled Castes/ Scheduled Tribes quota should obtain the caste/community certificate from the Village Officer/ Tahsildar.

Warning: Those who produce false SC/ST Certificate for claiming reservation under SC/ST quota shall be liable for punishment as per rules.

(b) **Claim of OEC candidates against the un-availed seats of SC/ST candidates.**

Other Eligible Community (OEC) candidates who claim allotment to the un-availed seats, under SC/ST

quota, if any, should furnish community and non obtained from the Village Officer/Tahsildar.

Converted Christians do not come under the SC/ST category. They belong to OEC category.

5.2. OTHER GENERAL RULES FOR MANDATORY RESERVATION

5.2.1 If sufficient candidates are not available for filling the seats reserved for SC/ST candidates, the same will be notified in the media and a separate allotment for SC/ST candidates will be made by the University. However, even after this, if SC/ST seats are remain vacant such seats shall be filled as detailed below.

Government/Self Financing/Aided Colleges Except Colleges run by Backward Minority Communities: The unfilled seats shall be filled up from the candidates belonging to OEC and in their absence, candidates belonging to SEBC. The seats that further remain unfilled will go to the open quota.

Aided Colleges run by Backward Minority Communities: The unfilled seats shall be filled on the basis of the merit as per the rank list from among the applicants of **backward minority community**, which runs the college. If seats still remain unfilled, it will be filled up from candidates belonging to OEC and in their absence, candidates belonging to SEBC. The seats that further remain unfilled will go to the open quota.

5.2.2 Claim for fee concession to OEC candidates: Candidates belonging to Other Eligible Communities are exempted from payment of fee at the time of allotment to PG Degree Programme under Government/Community quota irrespective of annual family income as per G.O (MS) No. 36/07/SCSTDD, dated: 03.07.2007. They should produce Community certificate from the Village Officer/Tahsildar at the time of admission.

6. RULES FOR ADMISSION OF STUDENTS TO VARIOUS PG DEGREE PROGRAMME IN AFFILIATED COLLEGES

6.1. Assessment of Merit: Except when otherwise provided, the merit of a candidate will be assessed on the basis of the grade points obtained by him/her in the qualifying examinations for admission to the particular programme, subject to such criteria as may be prescribed by the University. In assessing merit, bonus score will be awarded for extracurricular activities like NCC, NSS etc. of the students. These bonus score will be added to the grade points obtained for the qualifying examination for preparing the rank list.

Bonus score in respect of N.C.C. and N.S.S. candidates will be given for the purpose of ranking in the manner given below:

In respect of NCC applicants, the bonus score of 0.1 will be awarded on the basis of NCC certificates signed by the Director and issued by the Directorate of NCC to the candidates who have secured at least 75% attendance after having participated in its activity during the course of study immediately preceding the course for which admission is sought.

An additional score of 0.05 and 0.1 will be awarded to NCC cadets holding B, C certificates respectively for the purpose of admission to PG course in affiliated colleges.

For awarding Bonus score of 0.1 to NSS participants, the basis will be NSS certificate signed by the Vice Chancellor and issued by the University to volunteers who have completed 240 hours of work within a period of two years in the course of study immediately preceding the course for which the admission sought.

The benefit of bonus score for purposes of admission can be earned by the candidates only under any one category (either N.S.S. or N.C.C).

A Grace Score of 10% of Initial Index Score shall be given to applicants to PG courses who have passed the qualifying examination, after undergoing the whole prescribed course of study from a college affiliated to the Kannur University.

A Grace Score of 20% of Initial Index Score to the ST applicants of Wayanad district for admission in Arts & Science colleges of Wayanad District under the Jurisdiction of Kannur University as per order No. Acad/D2/2805/2017 dated 20/04/2017.

6.2. ELIGIBILITY FOR ADMISSION

6.2.1 Notwithstanding anything contained in the Statutes, the selection of students in Government colleges shall be governed by the rules prescribed by the Government from time to time with the concurrence of the University in respect of such admissions.

6.3. SUBJECT COMBINATION AND MODE OF RANKING

The Principals of all colleges have to ensure that, those students who have qualified from other Institutions/ Universities possess equivalence/ recognition certificate for higher studies issued by Kannur University before granting admission to them.

6.4 Loosing of grade points for subsequent appearances

Candidates will lose a score of 0.1 for ranking purpose for every successive attempt after the first attempt of qualifying examination, subject to a maximum of a score of 0.25. The numbers of chances mean the number of chances taken for passing any part of the qualifying examination. Betterment of examination will not be considered as a chance.

6.5 Resolving of tie:

In the case of a tie of index score, the following will be considered on a priority basis

- Grade points of the subject opted
- Grade points of the complementary I
- Grade points of the complementary II
- Grade points of Common course I (First Language English)
- Grade points of Common course II (Second Language)

7. Fee to be paid to the University on allotment

On securing admission, the under mentioned University fee has to be remitted online through SBI COLLECT only. The details about SBI COLLECT can be had from the website www.kannuruniversity.ac.in .**The printout of the transaction id should be produced in the college at the time of admission.**

Those who failed to remit the payment through SBI COLLECT, can remit the fee through E chalan . If fee remitted through E Chalan , the original pay-in-slip (University Copy) from the bank should be produced in the college at the time of admission. The candidate without the original pay-in-slip will not be allowed to join the college. The candidates should keep the original pay-in-slip after verification in the college. It will be required for further allotment, if any.

9. Guidelines for the computation of index Scores and ranking for the admission to Post Graduate programmes in affiliated colleges under Kannur University

Ref 1. U.O.No.Acad/D2/1121/2003 Vol II dated 16/07/2012

2 U.O.No.Acad/C2/2232/2014 dated 14/03/2014

The following steps shall be adopted for the computation of index scores and ranking for the admission to P.G. Programmes.

Step 1:- [Computation of Initial Index Score]:

Calculate the Initial Index Score by the formula,

$$\text{Initial Index Score} = \frac{(\text{Total C.G.P. of Core and Complementary}) + (\text{C.G.P of Core alone})}{(\text{Credit of Core and Complementary}) + (\text{Credit of Core alone})}$$

The Initial Index Score shall be rounded to three decimal places.

Example:

| Course | Credit | OGPA | CGP = Credit x OGPA |
|------------------|--------|-------|---------------------|
| Core | 56 | 9.711 | 543.816 |
| Complementary I | 12 | 9.700 | 116.400 |
| Complementary II | 12 | 9.000 | 108.000 |

$$\begin{aligned} \text{Initial Index Score} &= \frac{768.216 + 543.816}{80 + 56} \\ &= \frac{1312.032}{136} \\ &= 9.647 \end{aligned}$$

Note: As the students of U G Programmes for/from the year 2014 admission (CBCSS) have been evaluated on the basis of 10 point scale, the Initial Index Score also is a figure out of 10.

For the students who have undergone their U G Programme based on CCSS (2009 admission to 2013 admission), Grading System (2008 Admission) and mark system (up to 2007 admission), calculate the Initial Index Score as explained and illustrated in the guidelines as per Ref. No. 1. As this Initial Index Score is out of 4, convert it to 10 by multiplying by 2.5.

Example: Let for a student under CCSS 2013 admission,

Initial Index Score = 3.835 (out of 4)

Then convert it to $3.835 \times 2.5 = 9.588$ (out of 10)

If a candidate completed BSc programme in Mathematics wants to apply for admission for MSc Statistics Programme. In this case, the initial index score is to be calculated as follows:

$$\text{Initial Index Score} = \frac{(\text{Total C.G.P. of Core and Complimentary}) + (\text{C.G.P of Statistics})}{(\text{Credit of Core and Complimentary} + \text{Credit of Statistics})}$$

For PG Degree Programme under Faculty of Languages & Literature, 10% of Initial Index Score calculated as mentioned above will be added to the Initial Index Score as Bonus for the candidates who has studied the subject as Core. (5% of Functional English and Functional Hindi). Comparing this with CGP of Common Course, the maximum of the two is taken as Initial Index Score.

Step 2: [Computation of Second Index Score]

The Second Index Score shall be computed by adding the grace scores (G) to the Initial Index Score. The students who have done their qualifying U.G degree from Kannur University are eligible for a Grace Score of 10% of Initial Index Score, as per Ref. No.2 cited. In the case of other students, the grace score is Zero. That is, the Second Index Score is same as the Initial Index Score.

Example: If the student mentioned in the illustration above has done the qualifying degree from Kannur University, then the Second Index Score is,

$$9.647 + [9.647 \times 10 / 100] = 9.647 + 0.965 \\ = 10.612$$

Step 3: [Computation of Third Index Score]

The Third Index Score shall be computed by adding the 'bonus score' (B) to the Second Index Score. NCC and NSS candidates are eligible for bonus score. The bonus score for NSS and NCC is 0.1. NCC 'B' Certificate and 'C' Certificate holders are eligible for an additional score of 0.05 and 0.1 respectively. i.e., (The bonus score for NCC 'B' & 'C' Certificate holders will be 0.15 & 0.2 respectively). These scores are to be added to the second Index Score in the case of NCC and NSS candidates. [As the Initial Index Score of students under CCSS (2009 to 2013), grading (2008) and mark (up to 2007) are being converted to 10 point scale in step 1, the bonus scores are the same to all as explained above]. In the case of other students, the bonus score is Zero. That is, Third Index Score is same as Second Index Score.

Example: If the student explained in the illustration is eligible for a bonus score 0.1 on account of NCC/NSS, then the Third Index Score = $10.612 + 0.1 = 10.712$

Step 4: [Computation of Final Index Score]

The Final Index Score shall be obtained by subtracting a 'Handicap Score' (H) of 0.1, 0.2 and 0.25 from the Third Index Score of those students who have taken two chances, three chances and more than three chances respectively for completing their qualifying U G degree. The 'number of chances' means the number of chances taken for passing any part of the qualifying examination. Betterment of qualified results (Improvement) will not be considered as a chance. In the case the students who have taken only one chance for passing the qualifying examination, the handicap score is Zero. That is, the Final Index Score is same as the Third Index Score.

Example: If the student explained in the illustration has taken two chances for completing the qualifying U.G. degree examination, then the Final Index Score = $10.712 - 0.1 = 10.612$

10. Post Allotment Activities:

Reporting at the College: The candidates who get allotment will have to report before the Principal/Head of the College/Institution concerned for admission on the dates notified, with the following documents:

- a) Print out of completed online application generated by the Candidate.
- b) Printout of Transaction ID (Registration Fee)
- c) Printout of Transaction ID (University Fees)
- d) Original grade cards of the qualifying examination.
- e) Certificate to prove date of birth
- f) TC from the Institution last attended
- g) Course & Conduct Certificate
- h) Original Community Certificate/BPL Certificate
- i) **Non creamy layer certificate in the case of SEBC candidates.**
- j) Original certificates to prove the claim for grace marks, if any.
- k) Eligibility certificate from the University of Kannur in case of candidates who have passed

qualifying examination from Universities other than in Kerala State

- l) Any other relevant certificate for any claim made in the application.

11. Verification of Documents: The Principal/Head of the Institution shall be personally responsible for verification and satisfaction of the correctness of the documents/records produced by the candidate, at the time of seeking admission in the College/Institution. The candidates should fulfill the eligibility criteria prescribed at the time of online registration, in all respects, and all relevant documents shall be submitted at the respective colleges during the time of admission.

All the candidates securing admission to the P.G Programme should compulsorily remit the university fees (General-790/-, SC/ST-735/-) .

SPECIAL INSTRUCTIONS

- 1 Failure to report for Admission: Candidates who do not take admission on the prescribed date will lose their admission.
- 2 Candidates have the freedom to change their password. However they should take note of the password and application number carefully, for future login.
- 3 Application of candidates, who do not register their personal and academic data online and who do not give their options online, within the time schedule, will not be considered for allotment. No opportunity will be given to incorporate any details after the last date of submission of application. Late or defective application will not be considered, under any circumstances.
- 4 Any kind of false information will lead to cancellation of admission.
5. Any other item which is not specifically covered in this prospectus will be decided by the University and that decision shall be final.
- 6 **Preventive measure against ragging** : if an applicant for admission is found to have been indulged in ragging in the past or if it is noticed later that he/she had indulged in ragging, admission shall be revoked or he/she shall be expelled from the educational institution. Candidate & Parents should submit the undertaking (see ANNEXURE III) to the College, before getting admission to the college.

Any disputes pertaining to allotment/ admission, shall fall only, within the jurisdiction of the Hon'ble High Court of Kerala.
